Tuition Assistance and Tuition Payment Policies

- Launch Tuition Assistance amounts vary, and only cover the cost of base tuition for the program (not break days, late pick-up fees, late payment fees, and/or additional program fees).
- All Tuition Payment Policies in the Launch Registration Packet continue to apply regardless of Tuition Assistance amounts granted.
- Launch reserves the right to request additional financial documentation to support the Tuition Assistance request, and to verify all information that the applicant has submitted.
- Regardless of Tuition Assistance level, at a minimum, \$15 per month payment is required.
- If you are applying for Tuition Assistance with your subsidy co-pay, your co-pay must be over \$100 per month to receive Launch Tuition Assistance.
- Special Circumstances: In special circumstances, a child can be admitted to the program on an emergency basis, while your family applies for Tuition Assistance and then the subsidies you qualify for, for up to one month of temporary assistance, depending on financial circumstances. Tuition Assistance application and materials will be due within one-week of child placement, and amounts awarded can change after your family applies for/receives other subsidies you qualify for (which is required). If a Tuition Assistance application and required documentation are not received or completed within the 2nd week, and/or no family plan developed to apply for subsidies, full tuition can be charged and your family responsible. If payments are not made, and subsidy funding is not secured within the 2nd month of care, families will be considered private pay and Launch will stop care if payment in full is not received by the end of the 2nd month.
- Tuition Assistance amounts are reviewed quarterly and updated documentation could be requested.
- If your financial situation changes at any time your child attends the program, you must notify Launch.
- Launch Tuition Assistance amounts are subject to availability of funds and are never guaranteed.

The following steps must be completed in this order to apply for Launch Tuition Assistance:

- 1. Complete this Tuition Assistance application fully and email back to us with the required documents.
 - a. Attach copies of the two most recent pay stubs for all wage earners in your family.
 - b. Attach copies of last year's W-2 for all wage earners in your family.
 - c. If you are currently unemployed, or have other sources of income, just let us know in the application and we will let you know what to provide us.
- 2. Apply to <u>Washington State Working Connections Child Care</u> (WCCC) to determine eligibility to receive child care subsidies from the State of Washington Department of Child, Youth and Families.
- If you live in the Seattle City limits and are not eligible to receive WCCC subsidies, apply for the <u>City of</u> <u>Seattle Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP)</u> to determine eligibility to receive child care subsidies from the City of Seattle.
- If you are not eligible for DSHS or CCAP, you can apply to <u>Best Starts for Kids</u>. Best Start for Kids (BSK) is a King County childcare subsidy program.
- 5. If you are not sure whether you are eligible you can go to <u>Family Copayment for Subsidized Child Care</u> and check the table chart. CCAP guidelines can be found at <u>https://www.seattle.gov/education/for-parents/child-care-and-preschool/child-care-assistance-program</u>
- 6. If you are ineligible for WCCC, CCAP, or BSK attach documentation from that source stating that your family is ineligible or has placed your family on a waiting list. If you already know that you do not fit within the income guidelines for DSHS or CCAP please note this on your Tuition Assistance application, and we will reach out for additional information.
- Email the Launch Tuition Assistance application with <u>all</u> attachments to <u>TuitionAssistance@Launchlearning.org</u>.

Dear Launch Family:

Launch realizes the importance of high-quality early childhood education and care for all children. Mindful of the financial strain that tuition may place on a family's budget, Launch offers Tuition Assistance to those families who financially qualify. We review each Tuition Assistance application on a case-by-case basis, with consideration for special circumstances, and we encourage you to apply if you feel that Tuition Assistance would provide the assistance your family needs to thrive.

For families wanting to apply for Launch Tuition Assistance, we require a Tuition Assistance application be completed and returned – with all required financial documentation upon submission and a detailed explanation of your situation.

After applying for Tuition Assistance, if your family qualifies for a subsidy, Launch requires that families apply for Washington State Working Connection Child Care (WCCC) support (a comprehensive Washington State program that bundles several assistance programs into one application process), and the City of Seattle Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP).

Launch also offers support to families who have unique hardship circumstances, and who may or may not qualify for WCCC and/or CCAP assistance. Homeless households are eligible for expedited program placement and tuition support.

Throughout the Tuition Assistance application and evaluation process, Launch will communicate with you to ensure we receive all necessary documentation that will support your Tuition Assistance application.

Here are some ways you could receive help with your tuition:

- Monthly Payment Plans: Available by contacting Launch Finance Department (half payments to be paid on the 1st and 15th of the month) at Finance@Launchlearning.org.
- Working Connections Child Care (DSHS/DCYF): If you already qualify for DSHS services or think you might, you can contact WCCC for eligibility at 1-877-501-2233 or visit <u>https://www.washingtonconnection.org/home/</u>
- Child Care Assistance Program (City of Seattle): If you live within the Seattle city limits and do not qualify for WCCC/DSHS due to over income levels other reasons, contact CCAP at 206-386-1050 or visit <u>http://www.seattle.gov/education/child-care-and-preschool/child-care-assistance-program</u>
- Best Starts for Kids (King County): If you live in King County and do not qualify for DSHS/DCYF and/or CCAP, please contact BSK at 206-208-6865 or visit <u>https://www.bskchildcare.org/</u>
- Goodwin Connections (Seattle Milk Fund): If you are currently enrolled in a local university or community college, you may qualify for a tuition grant, for eligibility call 206-526-7944 or visit <u>https://goodwinconnections.org/</u>
- Child Care Resources (Homeless Child Care subsidy program): If you are currently experiencing homelessness and are ineligible for public child care subsidy or need help paying for child care copays, contact CCR at 206-329-5842 or <u>https://childcare.org/what-we-do/homeless-child-care.aspx</u>
